Pediatric Central Venous Catheter Care

This curriculum is designed for the community nurses and providers who have primary responsibility for the care of pediatric central venous catheters (CVC) in the community setting. The curriculum begins with initial training modules on general concepts related to CVCs. Additional modules review the evidence-based protocols and procedures to keep the CVC intact and functioning normally, as well as keeping the patient free from a catheter-associated blood stream infection. On-demand resources of quick reference guides and skill videos are available in the curriculum. To complete the curriculum, a passing score on the final exam is required.

Pediatric Tracheostomy Care

This curriculum is designed for the community nurses and providers who have primary responsibility for the care of pediatric tracheostomy in the community setting. The curriculum begins with initial training modules on general concepts related to tracheostomy. Additional modules review the evidence-based protocols and procedures to keep the tracheostomy intact and functioning normally. Ondemand resources of quick reference guides and skill videos are available in the curriculum. To complete the curriculum, a passing score on the final exam is required.

<u>Pediatric Ventilator & Respiratory Procedures</u>

ONLINE TRAINING – available to all RN caregivers

Access the links to the training site from your organization. Each activity will have a unique link.

Create a user login account for the training site Select the activity to complete

Credit is given for each activity. Complete the training included in each activity to receive credit.

- Some of the individual modules have CNE credit also; the CNE evaluation must be completed to receive CNE. When the evaluation is completed, the CNE Certificate tab will activate.
- The entire activity has a completion certificate, select the Certificate tab to receive your certificate of completion.
- If at any time the user needs reprints of these certificates, the user may access them from the completed transcript.

SKILL VALIDATION – available to selected educators/trainers/super users

Skill Validation via simulation. Up to two educators/trainers/super users for each partner company will have the opportunity to demonstrate the skills associated with each activity. Children's Heath content experts will validate the user's skills via simulation on a mannequin. The preferred method is to use a virtual network to connect and watch the user perform the skill. After the educator/trainer/super user is validated, they may validate others in their company. Skill Validation

Children's Health values the community partners and wants to validate the skills of your education staff in providing this complex care. Up to two educators/trainers/ super users for each company will have the opportunity to demonstrate the skills associated with each activity (central line, tracheostomy, gastrostomy). Supplies & Equipment





To prepare to simulate skills for pediatric complex care, the community partner should have the following supplies readily available. First, the community partner's educator/trainer/super user has a session with a Children's Health content expert and has their skill validated. Once validated, this educator/trainer/super user will validate the skills of others in their company.

CVC Training – Supply List

Accessing the Line/Flushing the Line

- Gloves
- Saline Flush
- Heparin flush
- Alcohol swabs
- Sanitizer of sink access to wash hands

Dressing Change

- Masks
- · Dressing change kit
 - CHG (if no allergy)
 - If CHG allergy is diagnosed and approved to use alternative dressing
 - ☐ Three sticks of betadine, sterile water, sterile gauze
 - ☐ Alcohol swabs, Q-tips, Tweezers
- If PICC without stiches: securement device such as Stat-Lock
- Biopatch (if not included in kit)
 - If CHG allergy: then polymem silver
- Clean gloves
- Sterile gloves
- New dressing
- Tegaderm
 - If Tegaderm allergy, then two IV 3000

Sterile Cap Change

- Masks
- Caps
- Alcohol swabs (4)
- Sterile Gloves
- Sterile field (2) (If a separate sterile field is not available, use the open sterile glove package
- Sterile Gauze (4)

- · Wet and dry Q-tips
- Three wash cloths (wet, soap, dry)

- Trach manneguin or doll with trach
- Shoulder roll
- Wet and dry Q-tips
- Three wash cloths (wet, soap, dry)
- · Trach dressing, if needed
- Trach ties
- Disconnection Wedge
- · Clean Trach tube
- Syringe
- Sterile water
- Lubricating jelly

Tracheostomy Emergency

Trach Emergency Bag with:

- Current size clean trach
- Smaller size clean trach
- Trach ties
- Lubricating jelly
- Scissors
- Syringe
- Sterile water
- Ambu bag and mask
- · Suction and suction supplies


Gastrostomy Tube/Button Training – Supply List

General Supplies

- Mannequin or doll with gastrostomy
- Gastrostomy buttons
- · Extension set
- Syringes (10ml)
- Water-soluble lubricant
- · Sterile or distilled water

Replacing the Gastrostomy Button

- Additional gastrostomy button
- Foley catheter with balloon
