

Dear Applicant,

We appreciate your interest in the child life internship here at Children's Health. This packet is designed to provide you with an overview of the child life department, internship requirements and answer your questions. We hope that this packet not only answers your questions, but provides you with enough information to decide whether our program would be a good fit for your learning style as a student. Please note that we are also looking to find the best fit and student for our program size and structure as well. To find the actual application and access required documents, you must visit the Children's website at www.childrens.com and search "child life internship."

About the Child Life Department

- Oldest Child Life program in Texas, celebrating 40 years in 2014
- Among the largest Child Life programs in the country (40 full time CLS at Dallas)
- The child life department provides services at the Children's Medical Center Dallas, and Children's Medical Center Plano
- The child life department includes child life specialists, child life assistants, music therapists, a technology specialist, a special events/arts program coordinator, and the facility dogs
- There are 6 playrooms hospital wide and a therapeutic arts room at Dallas
- There is pet therapy weekly, in addition to the in-house facility dogs
- The child life department helps support programming and special visitors through the Red Balloon Network, which is an in-house radio/broadcasting station

Overview of the Internship

- Children's Health's clinical internship program has met the minimum standards for a clinical internship program set forth by the Association of Child Life Professionals (ACLP). Children's Health's clinical internship program is currently *Accredited* and is recognized by the ACLP on their professional website.
- We offer fall, spring, and summer internships
- All rotations are at the Children's Medical Center Dallas campus
- The internship is 600+ hours, 15 weeks long, 5 days a week, with 2 main rotation placements that are each six weeks long, and then with an additional 1 week rotation placement of choice
- The internship consists of daily student group sessions as well as other readings, assignments, and journals throughout, which include the ACLP Internship Modules.
- Large assignments include: two small case presentations, a diagnosis presentation and a project presentation
- There is a designated site visit week for interns to explore other child life programs in the Dallas/Fort Worth area.
- The interns will work a designated holiday each semester (Easter, July 4 or Halloween)

Application Requirements

Note-there is no application fee to apply to our program. There is also no fee charged to interns who are accepted to complete our internship program.

- The application and detailed requirements are on www.childrens.com and then search "Child life internship"
- Application deadlines are: January 5, March 15 and September 5; these are "post-marked by" deadlines
- Applicants must be affiliated with a University both at the time of applying and throughout the internship. **Note**-at this time, we cannot enter into any new affiliations. See the link on our website of schools we currently have affiliation.
- Applicants must have completed a minimum of a 100-hour child life practicum under a certified child life specialist prior to applying and must submit the Child Life Practicum Verification Form that can be found on the website. Note-the practicum can be "in progress" with at least 50 of the hours completed at the time of the application as long as the entire 100 hours are complete by the time the intern would start the internship. Note-this experience can be virtual or in person and can be in a hospital setting or alternative settings. Hours working with children in this setting can be volunteer and/or paid.
- Applicants must have completed at least 100 hours of experience with well children and families. **Note**-this experience can be virtual or in person and in any settings. Hours working with children in this setting can be volunteer and/or paid.
- Applicants must submit a completed ACLP Eligibility Assessment Form. All classes must be completed by the time the candidate was to start the internship.
- A minimum of a 3.0 GPA in the major is required
- Applicants must have completed an ACLP Eligibility Assessment or include an
 Endorsed Program Letter showing all 10 required courses by ACLP accepted. Note-all
 required courses can be in progress at the time of the internship application but must
 be completed by the start of the internship.
- Two recommendation forms, using the forms on the website must be submitted: one academic and one from the child life practicum supervisor
- Transcripts from all Universities attended must be included

Application Deadlines:

Children's Health follows the recommend application deadlines and offer dates as set by the Association of Child Life Professionals and listed below:

Your Application will not be reviewed if:

- It is incomplete
- It is received later than 12 midnight on the deadlines above
- You fail to meet one of the requirements as listed above (affiliation, GPA minimum, child life practicum and/or incomplete eligibility assessment)
- The applicant is not and will not be affiliated with a University on the list on our website that we currently have an affiliation
- Additional items are included other than what is required above

Application Review:

- Applications that meet the requirements are then reviewed by members of the internship committee, using a screening and scoring rubric
- Applicants that move forward in the process will be contacted by a member of the internship committee via email to schedule a short phone screen, and then evaluated using a screening and scoring rubric
- The internship committee and Education Coordinator will then select up to 10 applicants to participate in the formal interview process.
- Following the interviews, offers will be made using the offer dates and process as listed in the chart above, which is recommended by Association of Child Life Professionals
- Applicants who do not receive an offer can contact the Education Coordinator to request feedback

Interview Process: Multi-mini Interviews (MMI)

- Children's Health uses a MMI interviewing format
- Interviews will be held one to two weeks prior to the offer date. The dates are placed on the website each January for the entire year, so candidates have ample time to ensure they are free on the date, if selected.
- Candidates will be contacted with one date in which all interviews will take place.
- All interviews will be conducted virtually
- Candidates will choose an afternoon or morning time slot on the given day
- Up to 5 candidates will come and be interviewed during each time slot
- Candidates will move through different virtual rooms and participate in short, timed interview sessions with members of the intern committee. The interview session will conclude with a virtual tour and overview of the program by the Education Coordinator, followed by a Q&A session.
- The interview is a behavioral interview format where questions will be asked around child development/theory, the candidates experience with children in various settings as well as the candidates experience with working with a team, problem solving, etc.
- A more detailed email will be sent to the candidates prior to the interview date, detailing instructions of where to go and with more details on the flow of the interview session
- Candidates will be scored based on a scoring rubric and the top candidates will be given an offer

Frequently Asked Questions:

- Can I still apply for a practicum or internship if I already have a degree? Yes, but you must be affiliated (enrolled) with a University
- I will graduate before the practicum/internship starts, so I will not be affiliated with a university. Is this okay? No, all candidates must be affiliated
- I really want to do my practicum at Children's; will I still be eligible for an internship at Children's? No, students can complete a practicum <u>or</u> internship at Children's, not both.
- I am interested in gaining more volunteer experience, what can I do? We recommend volunteering at camps, day care centers, children's hospitals, babysitting, etc.
- I completed a practicum at my university child development center; will this suffice for the child life practicum? No, a practicum must be conducted under the supervision of a Certified Child Life Specialist

If classes are not passed, then include the course in progress form with the application. Classes must be completed by the time the candidate were to start the internship.
